Connie is looking for easy patterns for "pre-cuts". If anyone has them, please email them to Connie at: conniewalterhouse@hotmail.com


Connie and Penny just got another order of batting in, so that will keep them busy for the winter!

Leah Mitchell is featured in the November Canadian Quilters Association newsletter in the question of the month section.

The question was "What is your favourite quilt block?

My favourite quilt block pattern is the Cathedral Window. I use three different techniques for my small projects:





1) traditional technique using two squares that are folded into two smaller squares and joined together (photo attached: Tree ornament)

2) four patches with two folded squares attached on the diagonal to each patch and then sewn together to make a four patch. Another patch is attached to the window space and the folded edge of each square is appliqued over the patch creating the window. (photo attached: needle case)

3) two "one seam flying geese" sewn together to create a window (photo attached: Xmas windows) This my own design using the one seam flying geese technique.

Joining the monthly guild Zoom meetings is as easy as 1,2, 3.

- 1. Click the meeting link that is sent to you in an email the day before the meeting...
- 2. Click on join on "join meeting".
- 3. Click on "with video" and "with audio" if you have a camera and a microphone. (You can still watch without these 2 items, it's just that no one else can see or hear you.)

You can watch on your smart phone, tablet (e.g. I-pad) or computer.
