#### **The Social Media Feature Quilt!**

It's been rough not being able to meet in person and share whatever we've been creating with others. I'm sure you miss seeing the quilts that we were treated to at the guild meetings in the past. It's been almost TWO years since we were last able to get together and celebrate each other's creations! Zoom meetings just aren't the same are they?

With this in mind we've come up with an idea to continue the tradition of sharing our creations. We're calling it the Social Media Feature Quilt and this is how it works:

- 1) Enter a quilt by emailing one photo of the whole quilt and one photo of a detail you wish to draw attention to this might be a close up of your perfect points, or needle turned applique, or the quilting, whatever you want to show off on your quilt. You'll email these photos to Judy MacLeod, <a href="mailto:jmacleod11@hotmail.com">jmacleod11@hotmail.com</a>; or Oksana Slipenkyj, <a href="mailto:oslipenkyj@rogers.com">oslipenkyj@rogers.com</a>.
- 2) You are limited to ONE entry per month. In June and then December when we usually have our Socials the photos will be displayed in a Poll and members will choose which one they like. This is like the Viewer's Choice at our Quilt Shows. If we're able to meet in person, you'll be asked to bring your quilt to the meeting.
- 3) The winning quilt will be featured as the Banner photo on our Guild's official Facebook page, the Guild's Members Facebook group, the Guild website and in the Newsletter.
- 4) There will be a lovely prize package for the winner coming from local sponsors.
- 5) The quilts entered each month will be published in the newsletter so we'll have some extra eye candy to look forward to each month.

#### **Dufferin Piecemakers Quilting Guild Block of the Month Program for 2021-22**

Hello Members and welcome to month #5 of our BOM program for 2021-22! Windsor, Ontario is home to the quilt store Quilting Confections. Heather, the owner, has graciously given us permission to reprint a BOM offered by her store a few years ago. Laura Coia, from Sew Very Easy, made **YouTube tutorials for every single block! The links were sent out in both September and October. This month you get the patterns for blocks 9 and 10.** 









By now you've noticed that there's a lot of extra fabric when you trim and square parts of the blocks up. I hate wasting fabric so have been making myself "bonus" Half Square Triangles from the Stitch 'N' Flip method used for the flying geese. This month you'll get blocks 9 and 10. #9 has these flying geese again – 8 of them to be exact. So, if you're already done with winter or just want a bit more of a challenge, stitch those cut off triangles up from the flying geese and trim them to 1 ½ inches. And save them for later. You'll do it all over again with block #11 in February. Then, come March you'll be able to use them in block #13!

SHOW YOUR BOMs AT THE ZOOM MEETING!

It's easy—just hold them up in front of your camera for all of us to enjoy!

#### January's Tips and Tricks from Linda Horner

1. How long have you been quilting?

Hi ...my name is Linda Horner and I'm a fabricoholic!! I've been sewing since I was a teenager...a long time ago!! Crafting, making teddy bears, ceramics, macramé ...quilting since 2002 or 2003. I've been a member of Dufferin Piecemakers since around 2005.




2. What is your favourite style of quilting?

I like all kinds of styles...mostly landscape / fabric art. And I love itty-bitty pieces!! I've machine pieced, hand pieced, machine and hand quilted....I'll stick to machine quilting!!

3. What is one tip, trick, technique or tool you would like to share?

I think the best thing I've learned is to just play with your fabric and try all kinds of techniques......find what you like best as far as styles or colours and ENJOY the process. If doing something is causing you to "stress out" or not making you happy then you need to re-think what you're doing. Also NEVER put yourself or your work down thinking "I'm not very good" or "I'm not creative".....EVERYONE is creative in their own way and as long as you enjoy what you're doing....then the "quilt police" can go somewhere else!!




#### From the Royal City Quilter's Guild:


