Days for Girls Canada works with the founding organization, Days for Girls International, towards the goal of every woman in the world having access to feminine hygiene. They make washable feminine hygiene kits for distribution to girls and women in need, include feminine hygiene education for the girls and women receiving kits, also train girls and women in need to sew washable feminine hygiene kits.

Watch this award winning documentary on Netflix

Hearty Congratulations to Guneet Monga, Rayka Zehtabchi, Melissa and the team of Period, End of Sentence for winning the Best Documentary (Short) award at the Oscars. The 26 minutes film set in Kathi Khera, Hapur Village U.P 60 miles from New Delhi depicts the sufferings of the women due to lack of awareness of sanitary pads, and feminine health care due to illiteracy. The installation of the pad-making machine creation of Arunachalam 'Pad Man' Murugananthamand and marketing the pad highlight the need for focusing on education and healthcare of women in rural villages. Though the film is made in India the impact will be felt in many countries in South America, Africa and Asia. Let us hope that the film will bring a change in the quality of the life of young women and gender equality in the developing countries before long.

We will also be presenting the President's challenge, The Duffies, Member of the Year and thanking all those who served on the executive and committees this year.

Just give Connie a call at 519-939-8783 and she will bring you your own little pile of untapped resources to stitch up into another Guild masterpiece which can be returned next fall to be quilted.

This past month, fifteen Community Quilts were delivered. Seven went to Choices and eight went to Dufferin Family and Childrens' Services. These quilt deliveries are always warmly received and make special gifts for many facing challenging times. The producing of all of these quilts, takes a lot of time and resources and dedication from many people. Our two Karens, Karen Turcotte and Karen Hunter will be arranging and delivering our finished quilts this coming year while Connie and Penny will continue to store the Guild "Stash", cut strips and kits for stitching and longarm quilt many of our finished tops. Val Ashborne and Trish McKibbon have provided stitching help and invaluable assistance with colour, design and patterns while Fern Pugh has co-ordinated the pillowcase outreach part of Community Quilts. We also owe a huge thank you to Joan Tipping and Rosemary Galbraith who have helped with binding many of our quilts and to Brenda Mullin who has cut and cut. We also need to thank all of our members who have stitched at home, donated fabric and tops and helped during our afternoon sessions.




Quilt Show Focus Magic of Cloth Act VII - Silver Threads

A receipt and membership card will be available for you at the membership table at the following guild meeting. Remember to stop by and pick it up.








What Kim does when there's no design wall

Block of the Month 2018 - 2019

This year we have decided to do a large block, 16 1/2", with a different colour each month. If you contribute, the idea would be to do one for yourself and the one to donate. Six blocks would yield a 48" x 48" baby quilt. Not bad eh? Setting these blocks on point would yield a even larger quilt.

We are giving you all the colours for the upcoming year so if you get on a sewing bender you could sew several months at one sitting. The diagram on right shows all cutting measurements. Dig into those scraps and have some fun. These are a quick sew. Here are all the colours for the year: June--turquoise
