



In March, life as we knew it took a turn as Covid-19 hit our shores. "Stay at home, wash your hands and practise social distancing" became our mantra. Overnight, Guild members went from hoarders of fabric to being prepared for a pandemic. Personal protective equipment for health care workers, other essential service workers and individuals in the community was requested. The Pandemic Protection

Project evolved and was led by Judy MacLeod, Oksana Slipenkyj, Fern Pugh and Louise Cornelius and by May11th. our members and their friends from the community had delivered 838 scrub caps & head bands (each cap &band requires 2 buttons for a total of 2,682 buttons), 539 scrub bags,163 ear savers, 500 face masks and over 70 gowns. Donations were collected and \$1,600.00 was re-directed to the local Food Banks. More photos and stories can be found on the Guild's Face Book page and the Dufferin Piecemakers Members Group.
