**NORTHCOTT CHALLENGE:** It's not too late! There's a few kits left. See Liz Nash or Linda Horner. Remember you can add any fabrics, as long as the kit fabrics are predominantly visible, **and** you can have multiple entries, maximum of one in each of three categories; *Mainly Pieced; Mainly Applique; or Any Other Item constructed using the Northcott Challenge kit (You must purchase 1 kit per entry)* 

Please consider a Northcott purchase when looking to replenish your stash. Not only a quality product! They continue to be a great supporter of our guild activities and our local fall fairs!

**BED TURNING:** Theme will be "Quilts made from Guild patterns, workshops, challenges, etc from over the last 25 years", from workshops to guest speakers, QBA's, fabric and block swaps, etc. Previously shown quilts will be considered for the Bed Turning event. **Entry Forms will be available at the April meeting from Yvonne Conway,** who is doubling up as our Bed Turning event chairperson. *Please note: These entry forms are not the same as the applications for entry into the the main quilt show.* 





**MEMBERS' BOUTIQUE:** *Donated items may be:* magazines (tied in bundles of 5), patterns, packaged fabric (with measurements and price attached), wall hangings, table runners, pot holders, bags, Christmas ornaments, cards, etc. Items may be knit,

crochet, quilted, etc. Note: Grantham Books will be one of our vendors. Therefore, we will not be selling used books.

Members may place items in the boutique on consignment at 15%. Consignment kits will be available at the April meeting. Consignment items may be: your own hand dyed fabric (yardage stated), wall hangings, table runners, pot holders, bags, Christmas ornaments, cards, your own pattern designs, etc. Items may be knit, crochet, quilted, etc. Consignment items must be delivered to the Registration Table on Thurs, Oct 31st between 9 and noon.

LAST BUT NOT LEAST!!! Quilts for the show We have over 130 members and would welcome over 300 quilts to display at the show. Ideally, every member has at least 1 item to share. This is NOT the time to be shy. I have heard many members worry over the quality of their work, only to be BLOWN AWAY when I actually saw their work! Please plan on showing your quilts. Even your worst efforts are admirable by those who come to see what we can do.

## Block of the Month 2018 - 2019

This year we have decided to do a large block,  $16 \ 1/2$ ", with a different colour each month. If you contribute, the idea would be to do one for yourself and the one to donate. Six blocks would yield a 48" x 48" baby quilt. Not bad eh? Setting these blocks on point would yield a even larger quilt.

We are giving you all the colours for the upcoming year so if you get on a sewing bender you could sew several months at one sitting. The diagram on right shows all cutting measurements. Dig into those scraps and have some fun. These are a quick sew.
