Quílt As-You-Go Made Víntage by Jera Brandwíg Thís book gives you a lot of choices – 51 quílt block patterns that measure 12 x 12 finished, as well as three quílt as-you-go finishing techniques. Quílt as-you-go is a doable way to complete a quilt

all on your own. If you're not ready to try this method, you can use the block patterns and finish a quilt using traditional methods.

Step-by-Step Texture Quilting by Christina Cameli

Take your quilting to the next level with these creative textures. Bring out the best in your piecing with free-motion quilting that begs to be touched. Christina allows the quilter to improve their skills with her step-be-step guide to quilted texture. March 16 - Sue Sherman - Fibre Artist

In March we will have a presentation by Sue Sherman. Sue has been working with fibres and fabric for as long as she can remember: Over the years she has enjoyed designing and creating in most of the established fibre arts: quilting, dressmaking, tailoring, knitting, embroidery, needlepoint, weaving and crochet, and related crafts such as beading and copper wire jewellery. Sue's quilts have been accepted to national and international quilt shows in Canada and the United States, as well as Studio Art Quilt Associates (SAQA) exhibitions. Her quilts have won awards at the Canadian National Juried Show, AQS Charlston, and the IQA Houston show.

Sue will have patterns for sale, so bring your cash or credit card.










April 20 - Helen Martin

This past month, Karen Turcott delivered 4 quilts to a homeless youth shelter and 12 quilts the Compass Eritrea Refugee Ministry. Since September, 89 quilts have been given to the local charities.

The February Work Bee / Learning meeting went very well. We had a really good turn out, for the afternoon, as well as, the evening. Many of us learned Penny Squirrell's way of making binding. If any of you missed it, she will have more copies of her instructions at the March meeting. We also learned about placemats, pillowcases and other sewing tips.

Elizabeth Bricker brought in over 40 finished placemats and 7 finished quilt tops! She has been a very busy bee! Val Ashbourne also brought in 2 finished quilt tops. Even though Elizabeth brought in so many placemats, we are still needing more. We gave out about 120 this past Christmas, and will need as many, if not more for 2020.

There are several kits cut and ready for you to take and sew. They will produce a twin size quilt top. They will be available for pick up at the Community Projects table at the meeting in March.

We are still looking for more places or individual people or families to give quilts to. If you know of any, please contact Karen Turcott.

There will be a work bee the afternoon before the meeting, Monday March 16th. Please join us any time after 1pm, with your machine and sewing supplies.

Town & Country Mystery Quilt March 2020 – Row Houses

We're staying in town again this month and bring to you our version of those pretty Row Houses that have been built over by Westside Secondary School. This one is truly a combined effort.

Judy designed the block at the very beginning, but didn't take notes or pictures of the process. Sheila excels at reverse engineering and took the finished block and came up with a slightly different block just to show how little changes can result in truly unique look. We hope that you'll step outside of your comfort zone and make yours uniquely yours. We want to see them!

It's another appliqued block, but simple straight stitching is all you need to anchor the houses and trees in place.
