You can watch on your smart phone, tablet (e.g. I-pad) or computer.

The International Quilt museum is located on the University of Nebraska's campus in Lincoln. It houses the largest publicly held quilt collection in the world. There are more than 7.500 quilts in the collection from 65 countries, made between the 17th century and the present.

In an attempt to provide additional and enhanced internet resources to guilds, the IQM recently created a special guild "portal" to the museum's website. Our guild has registered to access this portal.

February's Guild meeting speaker, Sharon Blackmore, gave us clear guidelines for sewing scrap quilts. "Variety, Value and Rest" have new meaning as we pull fabrics from our stash to create our next scrappy quilt. The more variety in fabric selection, the more interest will be added. This includes small/ large scale prints; florals/novelty etc. The value of light and dark fabrics and their adjacent placement to each other will provide the necessary contrast. Negative spaces, repeat elements within a block or sashings between blocks will provide visual resting places for busy quilt tops. (Summarized by Leah Mitchell)


