

MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL

It's that time again...please visit the membership table at the May or June meeting to renew your DPQG membership for July 2019 - June 2020.

Registration forms for returning members will be in a binder in alphabetical order. Please review your application form to verify we have your correct mailing address, postal code, email address, phone number, etc. and staple your payment to the registration form. This information is used to deliver the newsletters to you, contact you in the event the meeting is cancelled, etc. so it is important that we have the correct information.

The membership fee for 2019-2020 will be \$45. A receipt and membership card will be available for you at the membership table at the following guild meeting. Remember to stop by and pick it up.

The Quilt Label

Traditionally quilt labels are sewn on the lower left-hand corner of the quilt back, as you are looking at the back of the quilt.

Quilts entering the Quilt Show, including Bed Turning quilts, should be folded so that the back lower left-hand corner is on top.

The quilt's identification name & number will be pinned to this corner. If the quilt is folded properly then the Quilt Display crew will not need to spend time and energy refolding the quilt at the time of entry and the entry process will move more quickly.

How to make and attach a removable 4" sleeve to a quilt

- * Cut a strip of fabric nine inches wide by the length of the quilt top, measured between the binding, plus one inch. This fabric can be muslin or scrap.
- * Fold the fabric strip in half, wrong sides together (WST) and press. (Fold #1)
- * Open the strip and re-fold, WST, the raw edge to the center Fold #1. Repeat for the other side. Press without pressing out the centre fold. (Fold #2 & #3)
- * Open the strip and turn under each end 1/4" twice to make a hem. Top stitch in place.
- * Re-fold the strip on the center Fold #1, matching the raw edges, and sew a ¼" seam allowance on the raw edges.
- * Press the seam over without removing the other three pressed folds. Re-press folds #1, #2, #3 if necessary.
- * Pin the sleeve to the quilt top about $\frac{1}{4}$ " below the binding, with the seam against the quilt.
- * Appliqué sleeve in place on the #2 and #3 pressed fold. The center fold will be have a $\frac{1}{4}$ " slack to accommodate the rod used to hang the quilt.
- * NOTE: The sleeve may be pinned on with safety pins if the sleeve is no longer needed after the Quilt Show.

Thanks to everyone who has volunteered so far.

Block of the Month 2018 - 2019

This year we have decided to do a large block, 16 1/2", with a different colour each month. If you contribute, the idea would be to do one for yourself and the one to donate. Six blocks would yield a 48" x 48" baby quilt. Not bad eh? Setting these blocks on point would yield a even larger quilt.

We are giving you all the colours for the upcoming year so if you get on a sewing bender you could sew several months at one sitting. The diagram on right shows all cutting measurements. Dig into those scraps and have some fun. These are a quick sew. Here are all the colours for the year: May--pink, June--turquoise
