Program Notes



September 20 Kim Caskey

This month we will have a virtual presentation by Kim Caskey. Kim was the Canadian team leader for a project called World Wide Whispers. The project operated like the game of "telephone" in which a short sentence was whispered in the ear of one person who whispered it to the next and so on evolving and changing with each participant. In this case, a representative was chosen — one from each province and territory. The project began by using an original photo as inspiration to create a piece, then photographing that finished piece, and sending that photo and artist statement to the next person on the team and so on and so on. There were teams operating in the United States, Scotland, Ireland and the Netherlands. It will be fascinating to see how the quilts changed and evolved.



October 18 Karen Brown Go Just Get It Done Quilts

In October we will have Karen Brown. Her newest topic is called "Be the Best Quilter You Can Be", and it's all about embracing the type of quilter you want to be, and how to focus on the things you enjoy as a quilter. She is from Toronto and is a YouTube quilting inspiration!

Community Projects has orphan blocks that need to be sewn into tops. To enter the challenge, you will pick up a package of orphan blocks from Sue Pirie (30 Bredin Pwy. Orangeville). Your challenge is to complete a quilt top using these blocks and fabric from your stash. You could also "shop" the community projects stash at Louise Cornelius' place. Call her at 519-943-0756.

Need some inspiration?

Trish McKibbon took some preprinted



blocks that were meant for pillows, added some leaf blocks she had on hand and turned them into a top. Judi Sullivan took a limited number of blocks, added borders to some, created additional blocks and added coping strips. This is why it's called a challenge, folks!

Dufferin Piecemakers Quilting Guild Block of the Month Program for 2021-22

Hello Members and welcome to our BOM program for 2021-22! We have something very exciting planned for you! Windsor, Ontario is home to Quilting Confections, a store that offers fabrics, notions, classes, sewing machines and longarm services to quilters on both sides of the border. Heather, the owner, has graciously given us permission to reprint a BOM offered by her store a few years ago.

Since this program consists of 20 blocks, we will be giving you **two blocks** every month! Now here is the **icing** on our cake!! Laura Coia, from Sew Very Easy, made YouTube tutorials for every single block! We will be including those links with each month's block directions. This BOM is very beginner friendly! Pieces for the blocks are cut bigger than needed, and then you square up the components once they're pieced and you have put your block together. So, there's no need to groan over Quarter Square Triangles! (*Variations of Block 1 and Block 2 are shown below.*)

You know we wouldn't just assume the patterns were well written and accurate. We had to test them and check out the videos. The blocks would look lovely using a controlled palette and just as lovely using scraps. We went to our stashes for fabrics, and didn't have to buy any (Well, not quite—Judy bought a few blues to use in hers). Both Sheila and Judy put their own spin on the center square in some blocks. We also decided to go with different layouts and sashing options



for our blocks. We want to show how you can take the block and make a few minor changes to put your own spin on it. This is also shown in some of the videos. Of note; Sheila used only 18 of the 20 blocks for her on-point layout. She'll use the other two on the back.

We are very, very happy with our results! We will include photos of our blocks every month and we hope that you will share photos of yours.




Retreat News - Fall 2021

Museum of Dufferin Fundraiser: The Canadian Provincial Wildflower Quilt Pattern is Available Online!

Designed by Sandra Small Proudfoot for the moderately experienced quilter, this pattern first appeared in the August 1985 issue of Canadian Living Magazine under the name "Bower of Flowers." At that time it consisted of 12 patterns representing the native plants specifically designated as provincial and territorial flowers. In the intervening years the Purple Saxifrage for the Nunavut Territory was added, and Quebec changed its flower to the Blue Flag. Patterns for all 13 current, official floral emblems are included in both the digital and physical versions of the quilt.

The quilt pattern is available as a digital download (print it yourself) or as a folded pattern, sent to you in the mail.
