

The Social Media Feature Quilt!

It's been rough not being to meet in person and share whatever we've been creating with others. I'm sure you miss seeing the quilts that we were treated to at the guild meetings in the past. It's been almost TWO years since we were last able to get together and celebrate each other's creations! Zoom meetings just aren't the same are they?

With this in mind we've come up with an idea to continue the tradition of sharing our creations. We're calling it the Social Media Feature Quilt and this is how it works:

- 1) Enter a quilt by emailing one photo of the whole quilt and one photo of a detail you wish to draw attention to this might be a close up of your perfect points, or needle turned applique, or the quilting, whatever you want to show off on your quilt. You'll email these photos to Judy MacLeod, jmacleod11@hotmail.com; or Oksana Slipenkyj, oslipenkyj@rogers.com.
- 2) You are limited to ONE entry per month. In June and then December when we usually have our Socials the photos will be displayed in a Poll and members will choose which one they like. This is like the Viewers' Choice at our Quilt Shows. If we're able to meet in person, you'll be asked to bring your quilt to the meeting.
- 3) The winning quilt will be featured as the Banner photo on our Guild's official Facebook page, the Guild's Members Facebook group, the Guild website and in the Newsletter.
- 4) There will be a lovely prize package for the winner coming from local sponsors.

Dufferin Piecemakers Quilting Guild Block of the Month Program for 2021-22

Hello Members and welcome to month #7 of our BOM program for 2021-22! Windsor, Ontario is home to the quilt store Quilting Confections. Heather, the owner, has graciously given us permission to reprint a BOM offered by her store a few years ago. Laura Coia, from Sew Very Easy, made **YouTube tutorials for every single block! The links were sent out in both September and October. This month you get the patterns for blocks 13 and 14.**

This is the month that those of you who made the bonus HSTs in January and February get to use them! Block 13 has a 16 patch making up the center of the block. I used my 32 1.5 inch HSTs in place of the 16 patch in the pattern. My layout is a 6 x 6 with a 2.5 inch center square instead of the 4 x 4 layout used in the pattern. The HSTs from January were used in a plus sign and February's made up the outside corners. Of course you may choose something different with yours. You've got 32 to play with! The center square fabric is also used in the larger HSTs for the block corners to tie it all together.

Then there's Sheila's version! Honest, we did not collaborate at all on these but seemed to pick the same blocks to play with! For the center, Sheilla cut 1 ¾ squares; 25 of them that coordinate in such a way to give a "Trip Around The World" layout. No little points to deal with like my version has! So, there you have it. Two alternate versions to dress up the middle of this block.









We have all had one (or a few!) of those moments when we wished we had known about a quilting tip, trick, technique or tool earlier in our quilting journey. Hence, this new section in the newsletter. Each month, I will interview a Guild member and share their words of wisdom for all of our benefit! (Sue HVZ—Editor)

March's Tips and Tricks from Candice Kitchen.

1. How long have you been quilting?

I started quilting in 2003 and took my first class with Pat Kalapaca, my quilting GURU. I made a square in a square baby blanket for my cousin's first baby and made 6 or 7 more after that for friends having babies. My journey continued into bigger and larger projects leading to making bags with my friend Jacky. Now I sell my bags online at I Can Sew Make That for hobbyists.

2. What is your favourite style of quilting?

I'm not sure I have a definite favourite style. I love jumping into a project and making it work. Most of the time I add a twist here and there on purpose to make it it my own or I make up a pattern as I go with a piece of paper, pencil and a calculator; -) I do enjoy the full process of making a quilt from the piecing, machine quilting to the binding. I enjoy doing the binding by hand. It's quite relaxing.

3. What is one thing you know now that you wish you had known earlier in your quilting journey?

One of the main tips I used to tell my students when I was teaching, is to work with your cut up block laid out beside you. For example, a friendship star block; if you do not have the half square triangle turned a certain way the star will not appear. Then you will have to rip out multiple seams in order to correct it. Sometimes if you are not careful you can stretch the biased end of the HST and end up with folds in the fabric when re-sewn. Have a little side table or trolley with your block laid out so you can reach and put the proper right sides together. I then place my sewn pieces BACK on the block layout in order to keep everything organized and not mix top and bottom pieces. Here is a YouTube link from Bee in My Bonnet showing how to make a portable design board Bee In My Bonnet Design Board Tutorial. Hope this tip can help us stay away from our seam rippers!

Who would like to do some swapping?

This idea was inspired by a quilt belonging to Marion Cole. Lots of scrappy 2.5 inch squares are used and the end result is just lovely! Marion used a 6.5" neutral as shown in the photo below.

This is how it will work: We'll start with 2.5 inch squares and go from there. Please, if you're actually cutting for this swap, put a variety in the bag — not 50 squares from the same fabric. The whole goal is to swap out our stashes of squares for some fresh ones! Most of us are kind of tired of our scrap stashes and want/need that fresh infusion from your tired stash.

NO SIGN UP REQUIRED!

If you want to take part you place 50 2.5 inch squares in a baggie, along with a piece of paper that has your **name** and **email address** on it. Make up as many bags as you'd like with your name and email address and 50 squares in each one. In a perfect world with lots of bags if you supply two bags you'll get two different ones back. You'll get your bags back along with your name and email address paper that can be reused if you continue to swap.

You will drop these bags off to the passenger seat of my truck whenever you're out and about. If there is anyone who doesn't know where my truck is by now just ask. We'll do this swap



for a month or so, and then choose another size for another round of swapping. When I have enough bags to swap them out I'll let you know and you can pick them up from the same place.

Suggestions for other sizes and shapes are most welcome!

The one big thing we ask of you is to cut accurately so that the squares are usable to whomever gets them. Let's have some fun!
