The Ukrainian comfort project continues and we will be having another sewing day at St. Mark's on First Avenue (just East of First Street). The church has offered us space to sew there on Saturday May 14th from 9AM to 5 PM. Their only request is that we be vaccinated for COVID. If you want to sew, bring your usual sewing equipment and don't forget the power cord! We will be working on kits, binding, and putting on labels.

Children with cancer are already arriving and being treated at Sick Kids in Toronto.

Quilts of any size, from baby on up to twin are what we want to have ready for the refugees who will be arriving in our area. Some large bed sized ones are also hoped for. It'll depend on how much we sew! We are asking for donations from your stash - blues, yellows, and whites.

Louise Cornelius and Penny Squirrell are heading this up for Community Projects. Contact information and pick up/drop off locations will be announced soon via email or refer to the Guild Facebook site.

Then we will be looking to the longarm owners in our guild for quilting.

We will also accept monetary donations that will be sent directly to Ukraine. We have a potential contact for monetary donations. Becky, one half of Quilted Twins (their website has amazing free patterns that most of us already know about), is in Poland and has spearheaded an effort to shelter, feed and clothe refugees pouring over the border from Ukraine. We have to "cement" this contact so more news on that to come.

Last but certainly not least, a huge THANK YOU to those members who have already raided their stashes and given us fabrics to work with. We are so appreciative of members once again stepping up to take part in these projects we come up with. We still have more fabric coming so there won't be any shortage of something to cut or sew on May 14. Thanks to our members for your donations of fabric, time and talent. 

May's Tips and Tricks from Marion Cole!

1. How long have you been quilting?

Here it is 2022 and I have been involved in the Quilting world since 1995. I've surprised myself. My first introduction to quilting was an introductory course in Calgary, Alberta. We were guided through the process of putting together a simple pattern, triple rail, lap size quilt. I've often looked back on that first experience with gratitude to the instructor for her thorough covering of the procedure. She laid down an excellent foundation and I've produced a few large, medium and small quilts.

2. What is your favourite style of quilting?

I like all things quilty and I especially love the beautiful fabrics...eye candy, available at those dedicated shops. Besides the joy of choosing the fabric required, of which the colour purple is my favourite, I have enjoyed reverse appliqué, machine and hand appliqué, however I especially like cutting fabric into pieces, rearranging them and sewing them into interesting blocks. I usually prefer a pattern to follow as I have limited original creativity. Belonging to dedicated groups of quilters, taking classes and working on group projects has provided me with a bounty of knowledge, encouraged my productivity and the camaraderie is priceless. It has come to be that I really like making scrappy quilts. There seems to be a plethora of interesting designs to work with and hopefully put a dent in my stash.

3. What is one thing you know now that you wish you had known earlier in your quilting journey?

From one 'fabriholic' to another I'd like to share a thought about left over fabric, scraps, from a project....i.e. decide on certain size 2.5"; 5" then cut and store either strictly by size and or colour OR work all the left over fabric into the backing of your quilt. There is a very good book in our library that focuses on managing your stash. The real truth of me is I love piecing and I quilt-by-cheque.


