Comfy Cases Communication

1,070 pillowcases delivered so far this year. (2,031 was our total in 2021.)



Ronald McDonald House Charities Toronto and St. Joseph's Health Centre in Toronto are now receiving Comfy Cases pillowcases.

Hallowe'en and Christmas - We collect Christmas and Hallowe'en themed pillowcases all year so that we are prepared for the holiday seasons. Kids in hospitals enjoy trick or treating using Halloween themed pillowcases. At McMaster Children's Hospital, they hold an annual Halloween Parade. Christmas and winter themed pillowcases are needed too.

Fundraising - Know someone holding a garage sale this summer? Perhaps some proceeds can be designated to Comfy Cases? If you have ideas for other fundraisers, kindly share. Money can be donated through the Donate button on the Comfy Cases website. Select the Comfy Cases fun from the OPACC drop-down menu. We continue to be a grassroots organization - no paid staff - fabric is acquired through donations from individuals and companies or purchased (carefully) with donated funds.





The Orangeville Poppy Project

Prepare to see a lot of poppies this November as the Poppy Project comes to Orangeville. Residents are invited to help by knitting or crocheting poppies for a community art installation. The Poppy Project is a grassroots initiative that is working toward a display of poppies on the clock tower in downtown Orangeville in time for Remembrance Day.



We are looking for individuals and community groups to crochet or knit poppies between May and October. Participants are asked to source their own red and black yarn and use a pattern that is available at https://www.orangeville.ca/en/things-to-do/orangeville-poppy-project.aspx or a printed copy can be obtained at the Orangeville Public Library. Each poppy needs to have a five-inch tail (string) so the poppies can be attached together. Completed poppies can be dropped off at either library location in Orangeville. Donations of red and black wool can be dropped off at either library location.

The Poppy Project committee thanks the Orangeville Royal Canadian Legion for their support of this initiative as the Town honours local veterans.
