

CONSTITUTION of DUFFERIN PIECEMAKERS QUILTING GUILD

Article # 1: The organization shall be known as The Dufferin Piecemakers Quilting Guild. This shall be a non-profit organization.

Article #2: Aims and Objectives

- 1. To enhance the knowledge of quilting amongst the members and the community
- 2. To preserve quilting as an art form
- 3. To establish, maintain and update quilting standards
- 4. To encourage an exchange of ideas and methods
- 5. To participate in community projects

From the Achives \sim Leah Mitchell

Leah was able to identify one of Karen Poce's rescued quilts that she showed at our September meeting. In Barbara Brackman's Encyclopedia Of Applique on page 180 plate 86.24 she has a sketch of the quilt "American Glory" Paragon Kit She has drawn the sketch of the same quilt ca 1850. Leah let Karen know and she was so pleased. Anyone wanting the pattern to make the Dahlia block (first published in the Kansas City Star 1932), may get it from Leah. She has it in two sizes 13" and 15".



Program Notes

October Speaker - Millie Cumming, a fibre artist.

Millie became a quilter in the early 1990's (starting with quilts for her infant son), and has had quilts in curated and juried shows since 2000 She will be sharing some of her quilts inspired by nature, family and textiles.



November Speaker – Norah McGuire – The Journey I Have Been On

A quilter for over 30 years, she was first introduced to quilting by her maternal Grandma Smith. She will show quilts from her early days to present. She has been a pattern designer for Northcott and has quilt shop in Cambridge, Ontario. She will be bringing a pop-up shop.

Round Robin Quilt 2022–2023

Round Robin Project ~ Here is how they work:

Sept 19th. - Oct 17th, 2022 gather four friends and choose one person to lead. The lead person will insure the exchange schedule is on track and where the exchange will take place. Let Leah/Marilyn know who is in your group and who the lead person will be by Oct 17th.

Each person will choose their own design for the centre medallion. The Group may choose to have a theme (abstract, modern, nature, etc.)

Each person will choose and sew their own centre design, place it in a bag with extra fabric if they want it used in the next round, and pass it onto the next person.

Each person has a month to finish their round. Last round will end March 20th, 2023 at which time each person will receive their own quilt top back.

Each participant will have their quilt finished for Show & Tell at the June meeting.

Leah will also be demonstrating the Mastectomy pillow.

These pillows are distributed to breast cancer patients as they leave HCCC. The pillows are placed in the patient's armpit to ease the pressure of the arm against the breast.

The Orangeville Poppy Project

Prepare to see a lot of poppies this November as the Poppy Project comes to Orangeville. Residents are invited to help by knitting or crocheting poppies for a community art installation. The Poppy Project is a grassroots initiative that is working toward a display of poppies on the clock tower in downtown Orangeville in time for Remembrance Day.

We are looking for individuals and community groups to crochet or knit poppies between May and October. Participants are asked to source their own red and black yarn and use a pattern that is available at https://www.orangeville.ca/en/things-to-do/orangeville-poppy-project.aspx or a printed copy can be obtained at the Orangeville Public Library. Each poppy needs to have a five-inch tail (string) so the poppies can be attached together. Completed poppies can be dropped off at either library location in Orangeville. Donations of red and black wool can be dropped off at either library location.




DPO Guild "The Environment Quilt" Block Of the Month 2022-23
