CONSTITUTION of DUFFERIN PIECEMAKERS QUILTING GUILD

Article # 1: The organization shall be known as The Dufferin Piecemakers Quilting Guild. This shall be a non-profit organization.

Article #2: Aims and Objectives

- 1. To enhance the knowledge of quilting amongst the members and the community
- 2. To preserve quilting as an art form
- 3. To establish, maintain and update quilting standards
- 4. To encourage an exchange of ideas and methods
- 5. To participate in community projects

A quilter for over 30 years, she was first introduced to quilting by her maternal Grandma Smith although she did not get into quilting until many years later. Her trunk show will show quilts from her early days as a quilter to the present. She has designed patterns for Northcott and owns a quilt shop in Cambridge. You might wish to have some cash on hand as she is bringing a pop-up shop.

December – Christmas Social and Table Sale

In December we will be having our Christmas social and the table sale. This is an opportunity to sell items to other guild members. You could sell that fabric that you have used over and over again and don't want it any more or it could be that tool you used for one special quilt and don't think you will use it again. You could also sell things not related to quilting —preserves, baking, cards, other crafted items.

International Plowing Match and Rural Expo (IPM) "The Headwaters of the Grand" September 19 to 23 2023

The Municipalities of Amaranth and Grand Valley will be the hosts for the 2023 IPM. The farmers' fields surrounding Bowling Green and Laurel will be transformed into a tented city, RV park, plowing competition venue and parking areas.

Our Guld has declined the invitation to host the traditional August Juried Quilt Show, due to time constraints. However, there may be ways in which the Guild can participate on a much smaller scale.

Block Challenge

A group within the guild has decided to support the local IPM committee by organizing a block challenge.

Kits will be prepared and offered for sale across the province via the IPM website.

The blocks will be judged, and cash prizes will be offered. \$100, \$75 and \$50.

The blocks will then be used to create at least 2 quilts for presentation to the Queen of the Furrow and the host family.

Watch for more challenge information in the December newsletter.


A Display of Dufferin Quilts may also be possible at the tent city.
