If you make one of these "Fidget Quilts", please give it to Louise Cornelius, so she can sew one of our guild's labels and pass it onto to Bethel Hospice.





Her current project explores the quilt-making operation by women across Canada when hundreds of thousands of quilts were made and donated to the British Women's Voluntary Service and the Canadian Red Cross.

International Plowing Match and Rural Expo (IPM) "The Headwaters of the Grand" September 19 to 23 2023

Four of our guild members met with the local IPM committee on Saturday, February 11. We had proposed to set up the quilt display in the Amaranth Township Hall rather than in the tent city, but the hall is required for another task during the IPM. The decision was made to produce a quilt display in a floored tent (approx. 60x80) on the grounds of the IPM. The call will go out for quilts from the county to fill this space. Please watch for the registration form in the very near future. We are hoping for 80 quilts.

A raffle license is being applied for as we plan to make a raffle quilt from the challenge blocks.

The **challenge blocks** are coming back, and we have 40+ so far. Just a reminder, if you have a kit, please complete it and return to Louise Cornelius by March 1st. We have a judging day planned (March 4) and space available March 14-16 to begin sewing the quilts that will be made from blocks.


