CONSTITUTION of DUFFERIN PIECEMAKERS QUILTING GUILD

Article # 1: The organization shall be known as The Dufferin Piecemakers Quilting Guild. This shall be a non-profit organization.

INTERNATIONAL PLOWING MATCH & RURAL EXPO (IPM) "HEADWATERS OF THE GRAND" September 19-23, 2023

We have wonderful, exciting news to share in this post. The **IPM Challenge Blocks** were judged and the winners included 2 of our guild members. Congratulations to Kim Beckner (first prize) and Debby Panke (second prize). The third prize went to Eileen Parkinson from Fergus. So pleased that our guild was well represented and we had a winner from beyond the county borders.

Our next task is to **create 3 quilts** from over **100 blocks**. We are pleased to be able to make these quilts and use all the amazing blocks that have been produced. Our judge did not have an easy job in choosing the winners. We will be designing, cutting and sewing the quilts on March 14-16 at the Amaranth Town Hall (lower level). Hope you can join us sometime during the 3 days... come when you can.

Preparations are beginning for **our County quilt display** for the IPM. Please consider entering a quilt that has been made in Dufferin. It doesn't have to be current or made by you. We would like a representation of many eras in the quilting history of this area. It might be a wedding quilt you received from an aunt or grandmother, a quilt made for a new baby, an anniversary/birthday gift, or a pattern that you just love. The application form has been sent out in a separate email but is also attached to this newsletter. Please return your completed form to Lynda Moore by May 1.

Our display tent in the tent city will be 60 x 80 'and will have a wooden floor. The quilts will be hung in a similar manner to our previous quilt shows but additionally they will be covered in plastic to protect against dust and moisture. The tent city is a fenced area and the IPM provide security for this area on a 24 hr basis. If you have any concerns, please don't hesitate to contact any of the committee members. Looking forward to creating the IPM raffle quilt as well as gift quilts to the Queen of the Furrow and farm host family. Hope to see you there.


Support Family Transition Place
