

CONSTITUTION of DUFFERIN PIECEMAKERS QUILTING GUILD

May Meeting - Auction!!!

- 5. Fabric should be in clear bags with the approximate measurements.
- 6. Please do not put tickets in any bag before it is announced that the auction is open
- 7. If you brought it and it doesn't go be prepared to take it home.

It would be helpful if you could have auction items at the fairgrounds by 7:00 p.m.
