QBA JANUARY 6, 2024 Quilt as You Go Hexagons



Our QBA presentation will be a technique rather than a project but of course, a project can be created from this technique! **Fern Pugh** hopes to give you options for working with this method.

We will be trying out quilt as you go (QAYG) hexagons which can be a totally hand work project or we can incorporate machine work which makes for a quicker finish.

See photo for a sample of this method. This could be a table centre piece, a candle mat or just the beginning of a much larger project.

Gather your quilting friends and do it together. Don't forget you can post your





Creative Projects Panel Quilt – 3 December



Easy Peasy 8" Block All HST Make HST as before to finish at 2". Assemble as in picture



This is also a 12" block. HST finish @ 3"



12" Block HST will finish @ 3" 4 patch squares are cut @ 2" to finish @ 1 ½ Solid squares are cut @ 3 ½" to finish @ 3" Assemble as in picture



HST

To make HST, cut squares 7/8" larger than desired Finished size. Draw diagonal and sew 1/4" away on Each side of diagonal. Cut on the diagonal.


This 16" block is a little more of a challenge but you can do it. I'm sure. Using the colour guide, cut as follows

A – cut 12 squares@2 ½" and 1 square @ 5 ¼", cut in half twice diagonally to make quarter square triangles **B** – cut 4 squares @ 2 ½" and one square @ 4 ½" **C** – cut 2 squares @ 5 ½" cut in half twice diagonally to make quarter square triangles

D – cut 16 squares @ 2 ½", cut 4 squares at 4 ½"

E – cut 4 squares @ 2 ½" for outside corners

Using 4 ½" squares, mark halfway on 3 sides, draw lines joining marks and trim on these lines. Add a quarter square triangle as shown. After joining a Fabric A and C quarter square triangle as shown, join this to the 4 ½" square as in picture you are now ready to assemble as in diagram.

Pillowcase Update

I am so pleased to report that 127 Pillowcases were delivered to the drop off location in Brampton at the end of November. Thank you so much for all your contributions to this guild project.

The Comfy Cases program has delivered 5,708 pillowcases as of November 2023. This is up more than a 1000 from last year. The program is spreading throughout Ontario and is delivering pillowcases to kids in hospitals, hospice residences, Ronald McDonald Houses and other organizations that support kids with long term illnesses.



Our fabric stash for pillowcases needs replenishing so until I have opportunity to acquire more fabric, I will take a break from preparing kits. If you have kits, please continue to sew.
