The challenge for 2024 is to create a quilt that has one or more flowers. The flower(s) could be appliqued (turned edge, raw edge, satin stitched, etc.), or pieced like a traditional block such as Cactus Flower, etc.


Create a quilt/wall hanging/table topper for example Sizes:

- 1. 18" square or larger
- 16 x 20 or larger, throw (60" or longer)
- 3. larger quilt (72" or longer)

There are three categories for judging:

- A) Item that best meets the Challenge that has a flower and meets size requirement)
- B) President's Choice
- c) Members' Choice

I'm just a guy who likes to make quilts ... and tell stories. https://billstearmanquilts.blogspot.com/


Every day is an adventure as I try new things. Like the rest of life it seems, what can be done in quilt making is

My quilts make bold statements and provoke thoughtful consideration of a variety of issues.


"With the help of about 20 of my quilts, I'll tell their stories... my stories. I doubt that these quilts, and their stories, will remind you of your Grandmother's quilts."

Creative Projects Panel Quilt – January—Panel 4




10" Block

Make 4 HST's to finish @ 3" using A and C

Make 4 HST's to finish @ 2" using **A** and **D** Cut 4 **D** rectangles @ 2 1/2 by 6 1/2"

Assemble as in picture



12 " Block


A - Cut 2 squares @ 5", cut once on diagonal. Cut 4 rectangles 2 1/2" x 7"

C – Cut 2 squares @5", cut once on diagonal. Cut 4 rectangles 2 1/2" x 7"

Sew rectangles to triangles as in picture trim tails to make 2 sets of 4 triangles

Sew 1 of each kind together on the diagonal. Press open and square up to $6\ 1/2$ "

Assemble as in picture.




HST

To make HST, cut squares 7/8" larger than desired finished size. Draw diagonal and sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away on each side of diagonal. Cut on the diagonal.

8" Block

Square cut @2 1/2" to finish @ 4 of **A** and 4 of **B** HST to finish @ 2" Make 4 HST's with **A** and **E** Make 4 HST's with **B** and **E** Assemble as in picture



12" Block

A – cut 4 @ 2 1/2 x 4 1/2" cut 12 squares @ 2 1/2"

B – cut 4 squares @ 4 1/2"

D – cut 12 squares at 2 1/2"

E - cut 1 square @ 4 1/2 centre square


Unit 1- Assemble as in picture, 2 facing each way

Unit 2 -to each **B** square add 2 **A** squares and 2 **D** squares to corners by drawing diagonals on small squares, and sewing on diagonal, trim and press to small triangle. Square up to 4 1/2" Assemble in rows.

Sew rows together.



Artist Statement:

Quilts have long provided an outlet for creative expression, from the pioneer women of years past to the quiltmakers of today. This quilt is titled From Tradition to Non-Tradition. The traditional patterns are displayed on the borders of the quilt and the central design is created by its designer and quiltmaker. Traditional quilts are often referred to as our

'grandmother's quilts.' They are made from patterns which have been passed down from generation to generation of quiltmakers for decades and which have become a 'tradition' with many quiltmakers. This quilt is designed to fit a queen-sized or twin bed.

Quilts are made with love, and received with love.




