ORGANIZATIONS SUPPORTED THROUGH COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Dufferin Piecemakers Quilting Guild has been an active participant in the Dufferin County area and beyond for over 30 years—this most of us know. Are you aware that our wide-ranging commitments ensure that people of all ages and stages of life are

included in our outreach program? We assist and support a variety of organizations whose goal is the well-being of all our communities.

The charitable organizations that receive our support will be highlighted in this and future newsletters so that Guild members can get to know them, or be reminded about our relationships.

Dufferin County Community Support Services – Meals on Wheels

Hot and frozen meals are delivered to homes of seniors and disabled adults, which ensures their nutritional need are being met. This regular social contact also can help identify potential crisis situations.

<u>DPQG</u> - Each fall the Guild receives a request for placemats which will be delivered to clients. In November. We donated 100 through the Shelburne and Grand Valley offices. These placemats, which are approximately 13"x18", have everyday fabric on one side and Christmas fabric on the reverse. Even though the request for them comes in the fall, many members enjoy making them throughout the year. Note: Caledon Fair, held in June, is including this type of placemat in its Home-craft section this year, with entries to be donated to Meals on Wheels. Why not support the Fair in this category? Win-win.

Cedar Heights Residential Living


Cedar Heights specializes in the treatment of young individuals ages 12-18, living with brain-based disabilities including FAS (Fetal Alcohol Syndrome) and ASD (Autism Spectrum Disorder). They operate two residences in Dufferin County. Each one supports six to nine teens, providing education, life and social skill training, and recreation.

Individual residents have their own bedrooms and their own quilts supplied by DPQG. We recently donated six twin bed size quilts, along with stocking stuffers collected at the November meeting.





Crossing Squares (5)



Unit 4

Using your **B** and **D** strips, you will be making Four Patch blocks as you did in Unit 3. You will be making 7 strip sets. Press toward **D**. Cut apart every $2\frac{1}{4}$ " (need 120) to make 60 Four Patch blocks.



Set aside 20 of these blocks and put in a baggie labelled Unit 6.

Return the rest to the Unit 5 baggie.

Vice President's challenge

The first (of many) Guild challenges - LOGO twist

Finished block to be 8" - Due at our in person meeting in March.

Our DPQG logo the Briar Rose in yellow on a field of turquoise blue replaced our original logo in 1997-98 and was designed by Kym Ranger. There are no thoughts to replace this logo but I want to see what our members can design in their own

interpretation of our logo. Using ONLY the colours of the logo, design and sew your take, it can be thread painting, abstract,

paper piecing, felted, crumb or scrap, it doesn't even need to look anything like the logo. The colours need to be from the logo - yellow, brown, turquoise, gold, and teal (or green if that's what

you see in the logo) but otherwise the design is yours. You have until the December meeting to finish your block and bring it in. This should be a quick sew to get you into quilting mode for the winter and a fun way to try a new technique or try your hand at designing.

You may do more than one block, the more the merrier ! Blocks received will be used in a quilt.

I can't wait to see what you all come up with!
