## ORGANIZATIONS SUPPORTED THROUGH COMMUNITY OUTREACH (Part 4)


**BREAST CANCER CARE – MASTECTOMY PILLOWS** 

**HEADWATERS** For many years, the Guild has been donating specialized mastectomy pillows for patients receiving treatment for breast cancer at Headwaters HCC. The demand has increased greatly over the past two years and approximately 100 kits are now distributed each year—to both female and male patients.


The mastectomy pillow kits consist of one pillow and two pillowcases, plus a small note from the Guild. They are given to patients of Dr. Wang, and patients who have surgery (mastectomies, lumpectomies, biopsies etc.) Arrangements can also be made to have a kit delivered to Guild members or people they know, who would benefit from them. The pillows can be used under the arm or between the chest and a seatbelt, for example.

These pillows are made by two dedicated Guild volunteers, following specific directions for size and loft—so we don't ask other members to sew them. However, we gratefully accept donations of the following <u>materials needed to make them:</u>


Pillows – white or off-white, 100% cotton or muslin, polyfill Cases – good quality, 100% cotton (a fat quarter will make one case), in cheerful prints and colours (some gender-neutral), and 1/4" to 3/8" wide satin ribbon




It's time to put the block together. You will need the following units – Unit 1, Unit 3, Unit 4 and Unit 7. <u>The orientation of each unit is important so please check the</u> <u>diagrams carefully.</u> Press all seams towards Unit 1. Sew a Unit 3 to a Unit 1 and then add a Unit 4 as shown




Now sew Unit 1 to Unit 7 and then add another Unit 1 as shown



Now sew Unit 4 to a Unit 1 and then add a Unit 3 as shown



Unit 4. Unit 1. Unit 3 Your block should look like this when the 3 rows are put together Make 20




