THE GRAND RIVER QUILT PROJECT

Some of you attended *Weftfest* in Waterloo last month and would have seen a display of squares representing the Grand River Quilt Project. They were created by people all along the Grand River, from Dundalk to Dunnville, including Six Nations of the Grand. At that time, the project had 51 squares, 12"x12", with each one accompanied by a story about the creator's relationship to the river. The organizers hope to have more squares before reaching their goal of finishing the quilt in August 2025. Afterwards it will be exhibited in communities along the river.

Creative Projects Mystery Quilt

Crossing Squares (10)

Borders

Inner Border


From A cut 6 to 7 strips 2 1/4" x WOF

Measure your quilt top to bottom on each side and in the middle. Take an average of the three measurements and cut your borders to match. You may need to ease a little or stretch a little depending on the actual measurement. Sew on. Repeat for the top and bottom

Outer Border From **B** cut 7 strips 6" x WOF Repeat the procedure from above for attaching the outer botder

Binding

Bind in a fabric of your choice.
